

SM group builds new school buildings in Laguna, Batangas

SM Foundation, Inc. (SMFI), SM Prime Holdings, Inc. (SMPHI), and the Department of Education (DepEd) recently collaborated to construct two new school buildings in Laguna and Batangas.

Upon the completion of the joint initiative, two (2) two-story four-classroom school buildings will be donated to Laguna Resettlement Community School in San Pedro City, Laguna and

San Antonio Elementary School in Sto. Tomas City, Batangas.

Each of the school buildings is set to be equipped with learning materials, armchairs, handwashing facilities, emergency equipment, and PWD-friendly facilities to ensure that students, especially from low-income communities, gain access to modern, safe, and conducive learning facilities.

SM Foundation welcomed its first batch of scholars three decades ago. Since then, they have welcomed thousands of scholars, giving them the chance to go beyond possibilities—one of them is Junie Anne Mariano.

Believing in the power of education, she took up Secondary Education at a university in Cauayan City, Isabela. But for her, it was just the beginning of a journey that would change the course of her life.

"Hindi lang ako academically na-shape ng SM College Scholarship Program. At the back of my mind, I have set a standard for myself. It made me stronger as I conquered challenges. I made the initiative to study harder and smarter dahil sa panahon ngayon, hindi lang hard work ang kailangan; you need to be intelligent, and you need to be the initiator of the things you want to achieve," she shared.




Putting her dreams into action, she took the part-time job opportunities offered to SM scholars at The SM Store in SM City Cauayan. Beyond earning an allowance, the experience exposed her to the realm of business and honed her communication skills. She also shared the money she earned and her monthly allowance from SM Foundation to help support her siblings' education.



"I consider education as a ticket to a better future. If you have an education, you have the chance to land better opportunities. It's like a gateway to various chances—chances that will lead you to achieve your desired life," she said.

In March 2023, Junie passed the Licensure Examination for Teachers, reaching one of her greatest aspirations. But for her, this only unleashes new horizons

KSK Farmer: 'Nasa puso ko ang pagtatanim'

For many, farming is a way of life. They gain a profound sense of purpose when they cultivate the land, plant seeds, and harvest fruits and vegetables that will nourish not just their families but an entire community.

Cristina Lumor-Pabro, a Kabalikat sa Kabuhayan on Sustainable Agriculture Program (KSK-SAP) farmer, knows just this.

It was In 2019 when she learned about SM Foundation's KSK-SAP—an opportunity that would soon be her pathway to a fulfilling life. Here, she felt that a career in farming offered her a sense of purpose, community, and fulfillment.

From a humble backyard planter, she also became an agripreneur equipped with farming and marketing know-how and was empowered to cultivate the small plot of land they owned using her knowledge from the training.



KSK-SAP opened more doors for her. It was her pathway to becoming a member of farmers' associations—groups that later became her family where she shared her farming knowledge. To further support her farming endeavors years after KSK, she also registered with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) to become a Barangay Micro Business Enterprise (BMBE).

Aside from allowing her to do what her heart desires, the opportunity paved by KSK-SAP provided her a reliable, additional income. She now actively joins local trade fairs and SM's farmer's market initiatives, including the SM Sunday Market. The money she earns from selling fruits and vegetables goes beyond sustaining the needs of her family—she utilizes it to support and improve her farm.



Vital lifelines for low-income families

SM Foundation recognizes that medical missions have become an increasingly vital source of support for lowincome communities. It has made its mission to travel from Luzon to Mindanao to provide free medical care and services to thousands of patients from various hard-pressed communities, including some in Tuguegarao and Cauayan.

Two of their patients were Roland Bariuan and Angeline Cacanindin.

Two years ago, Roland suddenly felt weak and had to spend money on medical consultations and examinations.

"Nalaman ko na may diabetes po ako. Pero hindi pwedeng pabayaan ko ang sarili ko. Hindi pwedeng maging tamad ako dahil may sakit ako. Kung tamad po ako mamasada, wala kaming pangaraw-araw at gagastushin pambili ng gamot," he shared.

Through his determination to city health office for his routine checkups. The same drive to boost his health is also what led him to SM group's medical mission.

Through the medical mission, he received free consultation, blood tests, x-ray, and medicinesservices that would break the bank if he had it done elsewhere.

Making quality healthcare attainable

Roland's fellow resident from Cagayan Valley, Angeline Cacanindin. Her youngest daughter has been complaining about a toothache, which was already interfering with her nutrition and attendance in school.

At the SMFI medical mission in SM City Cauayan, her daughter's tooth was extracted. They received free paracetamol, antibiotics, vitamins apt for her child's age.

One of the patients staying at WVSUMC Pediatric Ward was first-time mother, Ednalyn Valdez.


Another mother staying in the new pediatric ward was Virgie Columna, a mother of a cancer patient. She and her daughter first saw the ward in 2017. "Kahit laging nililinis, luma na talaga ang ward. Kailangan rin naming magdala ng mga unan at bedsheets noon, lalo na dahil nadudumi sa kama ang aking anak," Vergie shared her previous experiences in the ward.


Providing the best start for children through holistic healthcare

SM Foundation, the social good arm of the SM group, has made it its mission to make targeted social investments in health care to help underserved Filipinos improve their well-being. For years, the foundation has upgraded over 170 health centers and public health facilities in the Philippines. This includes the pediatric ward of the West Visayas State University Medical Center (WVSUMC) in Iloilo City.

With many relying on the services of the ward, SM Foundation upgraded the WVSUMC's step-down NICU, pediatric ward for non-infectious cases, treatment room, hallway, toilet, and hand washing areas.

To ensure a therapeutic environment that promotes healing, SMFI equipped the area with specialized medical appliances and devices, such as pediatric cribs, bassinets, treatment beds, nebulizers, gun thermometers, a mini refrigerator for vaccines, breastfeeding and divan chairs, office tables and chairs, beddings, pillows, TV, water dispenser, ceiling fans, and a Mobile Play Cabinet.






